### The AMS Report Strategically Speaking

In September, significant changes will possibly be made to the Allendale Hampton Baptist Association. The annual meeting will be held at the Fairfax First Baptist Church on September 28, 2025. during this meeting, one will hear reports from associational committees as well as representatives from Connie Maxwell Children's Home, Charleston Southern University, and the South Carolina Baptist Convention. Also, some important changes will hopefully be made to the associational constitution.

These changes include a change in terminology from Director of Missions to Associational Missions Strategist as well as a change from quarterly to biannual Executive Committee meetings. Such actions will allow the association to conduct business in a more efficient manner as well as bring the association more in tune with the Southern Baptist Convention as well as the South Carolina Baptist convention. Although the Allendale Hampton Baptist Associational has existed for almost seventy years, just existing is not what the associational founders envisioned for associational life. The new focus of the Allendale Hampton Baptist association should be to exist to change the surrounding cultures for Christ.

One change that will facilitate this essential change will be a new focus on the associational calendar. The associational advisory council will meet monthly with the exception of November and December. During these meetings, monthly events will be planned to engage the associational churches in mission and fellowship activities that promote harmony and cooperation within the association. These events will involve and highlight resources and opportunities available to the associational churches.

Several of these events are available in the last quarter of 2025. First, the Pastors/Wives Appreciation Banquet will be held on Thursday, October 23, 2025 at Varnville First Baptist Church at 6PM. Second Camp Jackson fun Day will be held on Sunday, November 9, 2025 from 1 PM to 4 PM at Camp Jackson. Finally during November, the Allendale Hampton Baptist Association will gather food staples and unscented laundry detergent for the Connie Maxwell Children's Home.

The Association gave – Budgeted - \$1,000.

Stafford Baptist Church - Donated - \$1,000.

Hopewell Baptist Church - Donated - \$1,000.

The 56 children or their churches paid \$30 per child - \$1,680.

Total Income - \$4,680.00

Balance in the Children's Camp Budget \$1,238.04
